Good Morning St. Elizabeth family!

I feel so honoured to be able to share in this momentous occasion. You will require the ingenuity you develop in all your classes to build new companies that will create new jobs and boost our economy.

Every single student here today is tasked with the responsibility of developing their skills and intellect in order to solve the nation's most difficult problems. I strongly believe that all have a role to play in the development of Jamaica and if you do not apply yourself and receive the education your teachers are imparting, not only are you failing yourself; you are failing your country.

Now I know we are all accustomed to hearing the responsibility of our teachers where education is concerned, and the role our parents play in supporting and encouraging our educational journey, however, at the end of the day, even with the most dedicated teachers, the most supportive parents, and the best schools system in place, if you do not have a drive and determination to gain a solid education none of it will matter.

So I challenge you all today to take the wheel and be the master of your destiny.
